**Notification Concerning the Request for Extension**  
**of the Implementing Agreement for Co-operation on Technologies and Programmes for**  
**Demand-Side Management**

Dear David,

The Implementing Agreement for Co-operation on Technologies and Programmes for Demand-Side Management ("Technology Collaboration Programme on Demand-Side Management, or DSM TCP") has requested an extension ("RfE") for the period 1 March 2019 to 29 February 2020.

In accordance with the procedures established by the IEA Committee on Energy Research and Technology ("CERT") at its meeting held 16-17 February 2016, the DSM TCP submitted the End-of-Term Report, a Request for Extension Questionnaire and a letter to the EUWP Cabinet (together the "Supporting Documentation").

At its meeting held 12-14 September 2018, the Working Party on Energy End-Use Technologies ("EUWP") reviewed the DSM TCP and the in-person presentation made by the Vice-Chair of the DSM TCP, and, following discussion, synthesised EUWP Delegates' comments into the Working Party Feedback Form (attached).

After review of the DSM TCP and the EUWP Working Party Feedback Form, the CERT approved the request for extension of the DSM TCP for the period 1 March 2019 to 29 February 2020 by written procedure ending 29 January 2019. The CERT's decision was subsequently recorded at the CERT meeting held 12-13 February 2019.
